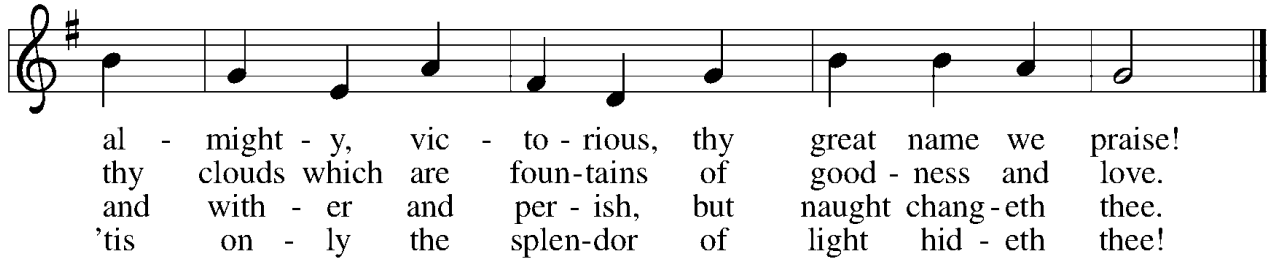
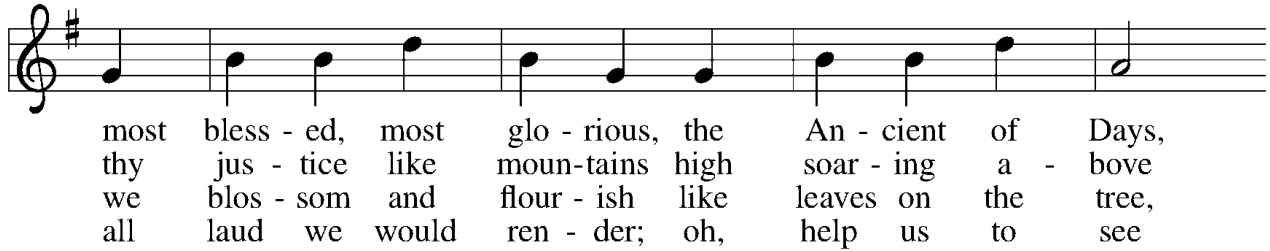


hear our prayer.
