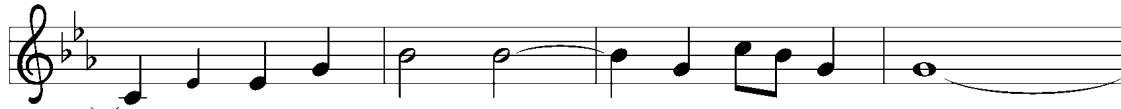

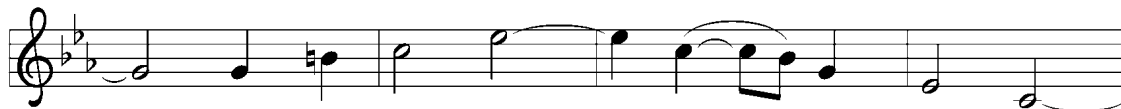

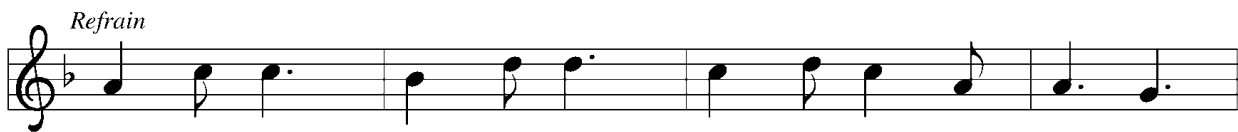

receive our prayer.

Here other intercessions may be offered.


