Note on Vocabulary

- "Assembly" not "Convention"
- "Voting Members" not "Delegates"

"These words not only fulfill certain legal requirements, but also reflect that the ecclesial understanding of the three primary expressions of this church—congregations, synod, and church-wide organization—exist and serve within this *one church*."

"The people of this synod are not sent as delegates; they are *not* gathered to act as some politicized delegates to a regional party convention. Rather, they *assemble* as duly selected members of this church with *voting* responsibilities for governance and elections on behalf of the synod. The Synod Assembly is just that, an assembly of the people of this church, some of whom have been granted the responsibility of being *Voting Members* of the *Synod Assembly*"

RESOLUTION #1 CONCERNING ELCA PRISON AND RE-ENTRY MINISTRY

APPROVED

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the New Jersey Synod Council create a Task Force that will encourage congregations and individuals of the Synod to participate and partner in prison and jail visitation ministry; create communications and support advocacy for the imprisoned, involuntarily housed and those on probation; as well as help to create a framework for congregations to work alongside and welcome formerly incarcerated individuals into the congregation's life and mission.

A RESOLUTION # 2CONCERNING A CALL FOR A CEASEFIRE IN THE HOLY LAND.

AMMEDED and APPROVED

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the New Jersey Synod in assembly stand in solidarity with those affected by the hostilities in the Holy Land calling for a ceasefire. And be it further, RESOLVED that the New Jersey Synod identify places and moments of solidarity with our neighbors living in the Holy Land and share resources widely to encourage support among churches, including, but not limited to: contacting governmental representatives, financial support of Lutheran Disaster Response (specifically designating it for the Middle East Crisis), and by engaging with resources from Sumud, the ELCA's new name for our church's engagement in accompaniment, awareness-building and advocacy for justice in Palestine and Israel.

Proposed 2025 Spending Plan for the New Jersey Synod APPROVED

This proposed spending plan provides the financial support for carrying out the synod's missions and objectives. This plan was developed in collaboration with the Fiscal Management, Administration and Property Committee. **The Synod Council recommends approval of this plan by the Synod Assembly.**
